

WANT TO CHALLENGE YOURSELF?

What is an EnschedeLAB nano-challenge?

Residents and partnerships in Enschede can submit cases as clients for teams of students via EnschedeLAB, a selection of which are offered as 'nano-challenges'. EnschedeLAB organises a 4-week nano-challenge four times a year, with a weekly one half-day work session. Students from the various educational institutions deploy their knowledge in multidisciplinary teams to solve these cases.

How does it work?

The nano-challenges are aimed at students from AKI/ArtEZ, ROC of Twente, Saxion University of Applied Sciences and University of Twente (who have completed their first study year). With each challenge, students are divided into groups as they go through a fixed program of a total of 4 half-days, during which they learn to apply the DesignLab Responsible Futuring method.

The resulting solutions can be further developed within regular education on a project basis, as an internship or graduation.

The underlying figure visualises the process of an EnschedeLAB nano-challenge.

Why participate?

In addition to the competences you develop - by working with this method - at EnschedeLAB, you also expand personal networks, since you work with students who are not in the network of your study program. Moreover, you get involved with the people who issued the cases: residents and possibly professionals. Moreover, you have the opportunity to use the knowledge from your education during your studies for 'issues' around you and also the challenges of the future.
